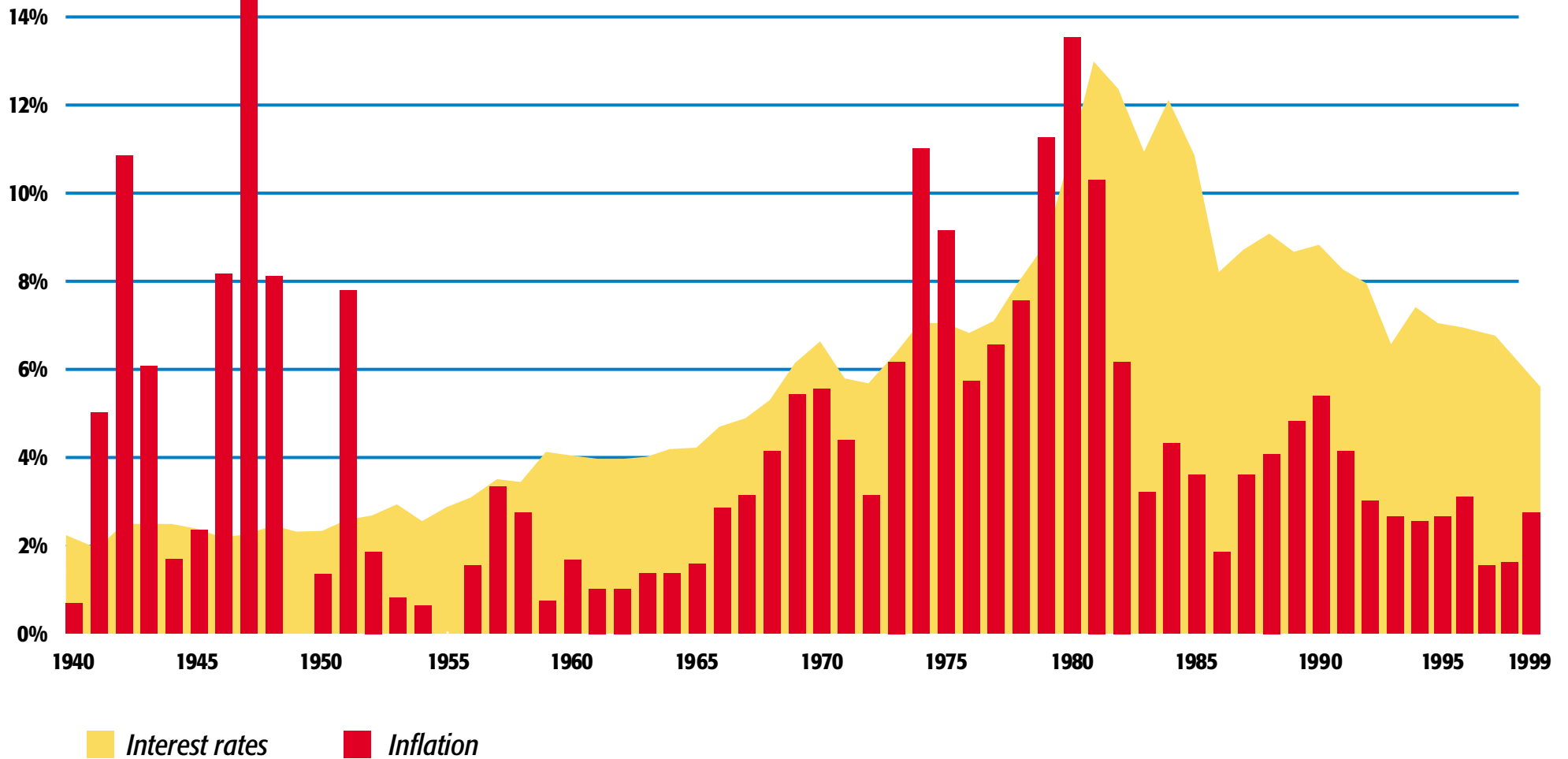

A Comparison of Inflation and Long-Term Interest Rates from 1940 – 1999

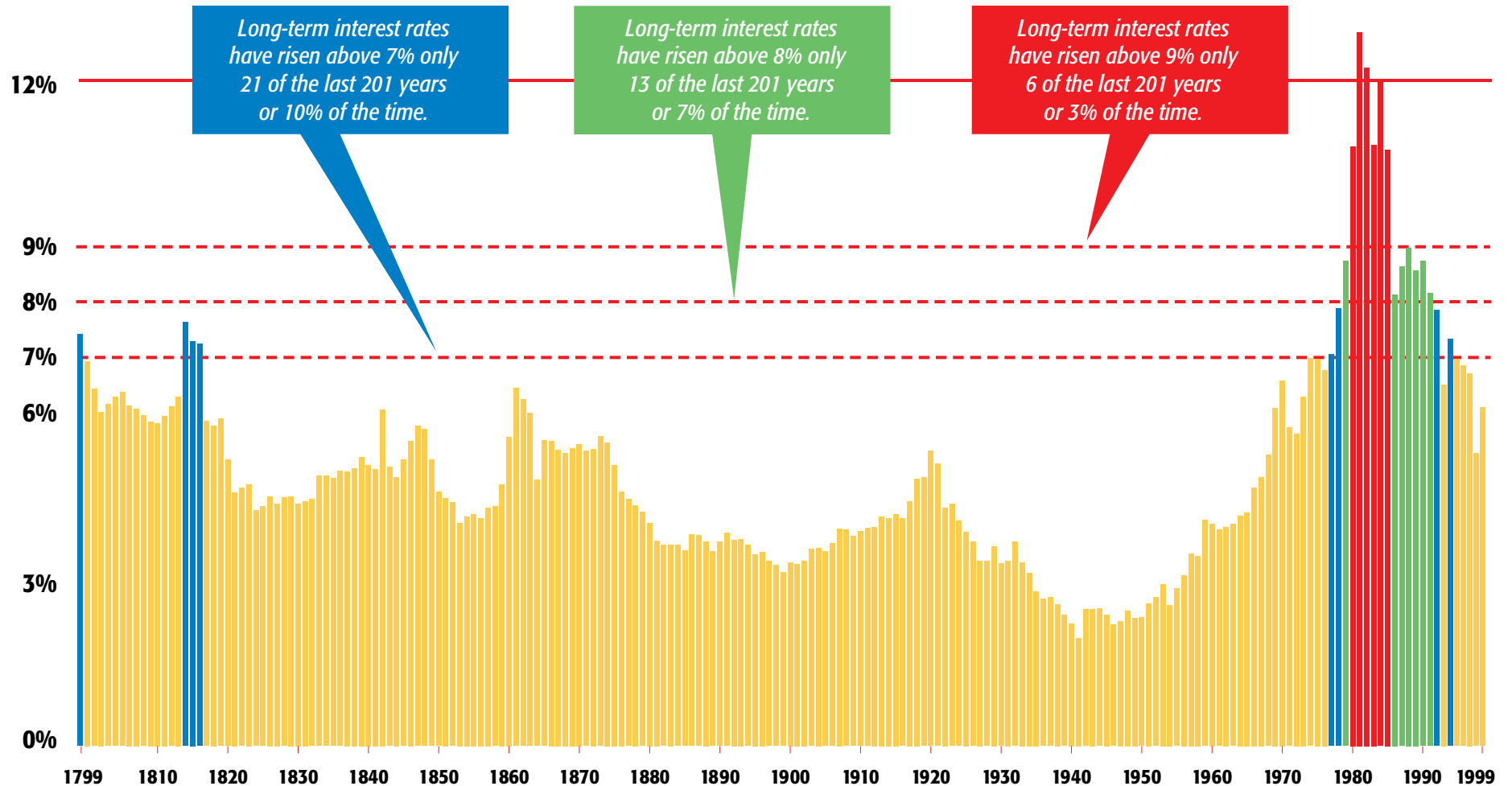
