Forbes Jr., the controlling stockholder of Forbes, Inc. with 51% of the shares and gave nine \$1,000 bequests to the owners of his favorite restaurants "as a token of gratitude for the joy their skills and genius added to the lives of those who've been lucky and sensible enough to dine at their restaurants."
